BOTH EVENTS AT RHODES



Artie Cabral was re-elected President; Al DeAndrade, Vice-President, and Ed Plunkett, Secretary-Treasurer via a nomination meeting held at the Union Hall on September 25. They were unoppossed.

Dick Salzillo and John Worsley, Executive Boad Member for the past ten years, were also nominated for their positions. Competition was created when Bill Custer nominated Carl Hosband also for an executive board position. However, Mr. Hosband subsequently withdrew the nomination to save The Local the cost of an election. He did, however, express interest in serving The Local, and has since been appointed to the wage scale committee, a position left vacant when member Dennis DiSano resigned during his move to North Carolina. The other members of the committee are Ed Drew and Tony Evangelista.

Hosband has also been named as an alternate to the By-Law committee, which has as members Manny Thetonia, Stan Holtzman and Ella Leone.

DeAndrade was elected as delegate to the National AFM convention with Art Medeiros as alternate while Medeiros was elected as delegate to the New England Conference with DeAndrade as alternate.

☐ CAVALCADE EARNS \$5,316

The Cavalcade of Bands, chaired by Al DeAndrade, held at Rhodes on Oct. 23, earned \$5,316, with total reciepts of \$7,735 minus expenses of \$2,419. There was a paid attendance of 594 persons.

DeAndrade himself sold approximately one quarter of the tickets, 140, The Local office sold about half, 226 tickets. The balance was sold by musicians, friends and Rhodes.

The largest expenses were the rental of Rhodes, \$750, police, \$468, and fire \$339.90. Mailings cost \$453.

Musicians provided instruments at no charge; piano, Ed Plunkett, Brian Mullaney and Steve Badessa; drums, Randy Cloutier, Joe Holtzman and John Badessa; sound by Art Medeiros, Larry Perlman, Steve Badessa and Jan Marquez.

The music groups donating their services were; Art Medeiros and Dick Parent, in the ballroom, along with Hank Doiron and Tommy Rotondo Strollers. Terri Giviens sang.

In the foyer were Ed Drew's Dixieland Pops; Pat Mitchell, John Badessa, Shawn Monteiro, Mac Chrupcala and Tony Cipolla. Vocalists were Charlie Harris, Nicolas King and Ms. Giviens.

MINUTES OF EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETINGS

Call to Order: 11:00 AM July 24, 2007

Roll Call: Present: All Secetary's Report: Approved Financial Statements: Approved

Finance Committee: Chariman Bob Juliano presents a verbal report from the Finance Committee, expressing concern about the financial status of the local. The board agrees to schedule an additional meeting on Thursday, August 9, solely for the purpose of discussing finances.

Old Business:

Non Union Flyers: S/T inquires about the flyers distributed at the last Cavalcade of Bands for the non-union group "Night Life Orchestra". V/P reports that he contacted the leader, Mark Bedrossian, who assured him that he had nothing to do with the flyers.

Big Band Scale: V/P inquires about the status of the proposed wage scale for big bands. Pres responds that the wage scale must be approved at the next general membership meeting, that the vote taken at the last meeting was not vaild due to insufficent notice to members.

AFM Convention: V/P reports on a few aspects of the AFM convention held in Las Vegas, June 18-20. National leadership urged locals to participate in their central labor councils and state AFL-CIO. The AFM faces continuing problems with the lack of royalities paid on downloaded music, internet web sites, pirated music, etc. Nationally, membership continues to decline (down to 90,000).

Leadership urges more recruting efforts at both the local and national levels.

RIPO: VP inquires about Rhode Island Philharmonic Orchestra, continuing to hire players from outside the local. Pres replies that the situation is currently under review with the orchestra committee.

Call to Order: 11:05 AM August 9, 2007 Roll Call: Present: All

New Business: Finance: S/T reports that the local is operating in a deficit mode and that the financial status of the local is a concern. A discussion ensures as to the state of the local's finances, to find ways to increase or enhance revenues. A number of suggestions are considered.

Cavalcade Financial Management: Finance Committee Chairman Jullano reports that the opinion of the Finance Committee is that all receipts from the Cavalcade of Bands should be managed by the Finance Committee itself, rather than by the Cavalcade chairman.

Cavalcade Format: EBM Worsley expresses the opinion that the format of the Cavalcade needs to be updated somewhat and that different styles of music should be added to the programs.

Call to order: 11:10 AM, August 14, 2007 Roll Call: Present: Cabral, DeAndrade, Plunkett, Sazillo Excused: Worsley Also Attending: Finance Committee Chairman Bob Juliano. Secetary's Report: July 24 minutes - S/T presents the minutes of the Executive Board meeting helo on July 24, 2007. (1) VP notes a misstatement under old business, regarding the placement of non-union contractor, did not place flyers INSIDE the ballroom, although he did leaflet the parking lot. (2) Pres noted an error under old business regarding the Rhode Island Philharmonic Orchestra. The use of non-member substitutes is underway with the Federation, as well as the orchestra committee. August 9 minutes: EBM Salzillo moves to accept the minutes of the August 9 meeting. VP seconds the motion. Motion carries. Treasurer's Reports: Financial Statements - Approved July, 2007. VP moves to accept the Treasurer's report. EBM Salzillo seconds. The motion carries. Work Dues: Pres inquires if casual work dues are being paid. S/T responds that the monthly invoices are being sent out for both membership dues and work dues. The compliance rates from members has been very good. New Business: Membership Drive - VP suggests asking the Federation to waive its national initiation fee as part of the current membership drive. Meeting Times: VP raises the issue of complying strictly with the day and time for Executive Board meetings, as set forth in Article III, Section 5, paragraph (b) of the local's by-laws. There is a discussion of changing the meeting time to the third Wednesday of the month. The change would allow the Treasurer to prepare more accurate financial statements from the monthly bank statements, which are not received until approximately the tenth day of the month. Meting adjourns: 1:00 PM

Call to order: 9:36 AM Sept 17, 2007 Roll Call: Present: Cabral; DeAndrade; Plunkett; Salzillo. Excused: Worsley. Secetary's Report: Approved. Treasurers Reports: Approved. Work Dues: Pres inquirers if casual work dues are being paid. S/T responds that monthly invoices are being sent out for both membeship dues and work dues. The compliance rate from members has been very good. Communications: Health Insurance - Pres provides a printout from a company called "Group Health Care", which provides health insurance to individuals. The company is endorsed by the AFM. He plans to publish information about the company in the Fanfare, so that members can inqure if they are interested. RIPO Poll - S/T presents copies of an informal poll he has sent to members of the Rhode Island Philharmonic Orchestra, to gauge their opinions on how many performance substitute musicians should be allowed to perform before being required to join the local. At this point not enough responses have been returned to get a general consensus.

Call to order: 9:37 AM October 15, 2007 Roll Call: Present: Cabral; DeAndrade; Plunkett; Salzillo; Worsley. Secetary's Report: September minutes approved. Authorizing Motions: S/T requests authorizing motions to approve transfers of funds from the Cavalcade Fund and the Reserve Fund into the General Fund to cover operating expenses. EBM moves to approve the transfer of \$8,500.00 from the Cavalcade Fund into the General Fund, to cover 3rd quarter operating expenses, with the understanding that the actual funds transfers took place during the 3rd quarter. VP seconds the motion. The motion carries. EBM Worsley moves to approve the transfer of \$10,000.00 from the Reserve Fund into the General Fund to cover 4th quarter operating expenses, with the understanding that the actual funds transfer already took place at the beginning of the 4th quarter. VP seconds the motion. The motion carries. Committee Reports: Golf Tournament - VP presents the final report of the 2007 Golf Tournament. He states that the Golf Tournament realized a net profit of \$2,350.00. EBM Worsley inquires about the possibility of moving the event to a new venue next year. There is a discussion about whether to emphasize more participation by member of the local or to concentrate on maximizing revenue for the tournament. EBM Salzillo moves to accept the report. S/T seconds the motion. The motion carries. Cavalcade: VP reports that all groups will start on the hour for the Oct. 23 Cavalcade. The "Appreication Dinner" may have to be moved to a location other than Antonio's Restaurant which is undergoing renovations. He is considering Basta Restaurant in the Edgewook section of Cranston, near Rhodes-on-the-Pawtuxet for February 12, 2008, for a Valentine's Day dance to be sponsored by the local and also for May 27, 2008, for the spring Cavalcade. Office furniture: Pres expresses an interest in purchasing new chairs to accommodate members at membership meetings. S/T suggests waiting until after all revenues have been received from the upcoming Cavalcade.
